- Chelmsford ranked 21st out of 100 Best Places to Live in Money Magazine's "2007 Best Places to Live - Top 100 [Towns List]".
- Chelmsford is designated as "BIOREADY" by Massachusetts Biotechnology Council. Chelmsford has a silver BioReady™ status.
- Middlesex County, where Chelmsford is located, is ranked among the top 5 regions for NANOTECHNOLOGY businesses- The Project on Emerging Nanotechnologies ranked Middlesex County, which includes Chelmsford, as one of the top five regions for nanotechnology business, research and education clusters

Rt 3/Rt 129 — Large office complexes, many corporate headquarters, most of the town's largest employers.



Town Center/Rt. 110 — The town center is designated as a historic district by the state. here are many store fronts for window shopping and civic services. It has many local businesses with restaurant, retail, office, and services spaces. Rt. 110 extends from the center south toward Lowell and west toward Westford with a variety of businesses ranging from retail, restaurants, services, housing, commercial and offices.



North Chelmsford/Vinal Square

Store front window shopping area is home to a variety of neighborhood retail and services businesses clustered around the historic village and several renovated mill complexes.



Drum Hill

Located immediately off Rt. 3, exit 32, it is home to a mix of uses ranging from large retail to boutiques, restaurants, specialized housing, townhouse office complexes and medical centers.
